NEW FORMAT FOR 2019



Changes have been made to improve the layout of the event with Cattle being brought back into Hall 2. Cattle will be stalled in a marquee outside of the Hall.

The Beef Fatstock classes and championships will all be held on Saturday, meaning those animals can leave from 5pm on Saturday (anyone wishing to stay overnight can stall their animals in the cattle sheds as the marquee will be thoroughly cleaned out for the animals competing on the Sunday - although space is limited).

This year will see the introduction of the Pedigree Calf Section and this will take place in Hall 2 on the Sunday, again with the animals being stalled in the marquee.

The White Rose Ring will continue to hold Ridden Coloureds and the Olympia Ridden Mountain & Moorland Section followed by a host of TSR classes on both afternoons.

The Sheep marquee will be very busy again holding CSL Sheep and the RBST Classes on both days.

BEEF FATSTOCK CLASSES - SATURDAY

Weighing will be between 2pm - 4pm on Friday 18 October; after which classes will be created equally by weight. Weight sheets will be available from 8am on the Saturday morning. Animals can be brought on to the showground from 12 noon – 6pm on Thursday 17 October or from 8.00am - 3pm on Friday 18 October. Beef Fatstock animals cannot leave the Showground before 5pm on Saturday 19 October. Stalls will be restricted to 4 per exhibitor. Access to the showground outside of the stated times is not permitted.

No animal to be shown in more than one class. Cattle will be stalled in exhibitor order. Cattle will be judged in weight order. Ear numbers and passports will be recorded and checked at the time of weighing (although they do not need to be stated on the entry form; this allows for substitutions to be made nearer to the Show).

Only one exhibitor is allowed in the judging ring at any one time; an exception will be made in the Young Handlers class.

In the interests of fairness, all sheep must be weighed without any rugs or blankets of any kind.

All sheep must be shown in the Judging Ring. Please ensure your sheep are entered in the correct section: **TRIMMED** or **UNTRIMMED**.

Sheep will be inspected on arrival re trimming regulations. Any persons breaking the rules of the section will be disqualified and entry fees will NOT be refunded in these circumstances.

Lambs can **ONLY** be entered into one class (with the exception of the Single Lamb class where the lamb must have been entered in a previous class to be eligible to compete).

COLOURED CLASSES - OPEN TO ALL EXHIBITORS

Any horse/pony can enter the Coloured classes. These classes are affiliated to CHAPS (UK). They qualify for both the CHAPS Championship Show 2020 and the Winter Restricted Finals at the BSPS Winter Championships (March 2020) Show.

You do not need to be a member nor your horse registered with CHAPS (UK) in order to compete in these classes. However, should you wish to qualify for the CHAPS Championships 2020, you need to have your 2019 Qualifier Card in the ring for signing by the judge (These can be obtained from CHAPS Admin, 1 McLaren Cottages, Abertyswygg, Rhydney, Tredegar, NP22 5BH).

For the Winter Restricted Qualifier you do not need to be a member nor your horse registered, but membership and registration must be in place at the time of the finals. Qualification for the Winter Restricted Finals may only be taken to Exhibits that have not qualified for HOYS in the two previous years, i.e. for the 2020 finals, not to have qualified for HOYS in 2018 and 2019.

In all cases Stallions must be graded with CHAPS (UK) and wear their Stallions Discs in the ring.

Who Can Enter?

The finals are open to riders/ handlers who have qualified and hold a TSR card or a signed 2018 Equifest Card. Riders MUST not have qualified for HOYS in 2018/2019. You need to show the card to the steward when you enter the ring so make sure you take a COPY of your Equifest Card before you send in your entries for these shows.

What Classes can I enter? The RIDER/HANDLER has qualified and can enter ANY of the TSR Finals on any horse/pony (it does not have to be the pony/horse they qualified on).

Do I need to be a TSR Member? You DO NOT have to be a TSR to enter.

Show Opening Times

Saturday 19 October - 9am – 5pm

Sunday 20 October - 9am – 5pm

1 ENTRY FEES

Entry fees are shown at the front of each section and on the entry form. These will only be refunded in the event of cancellation of classes owing to insufficient entries or exhibitors, or to exhibitors who present a valid veterinary certificate (with the exhibitor pack relating to the entry) by Friday 25 October. All fees will be forfeited by any exhibitor who fails to exhibit.

2 SUBSTITUTION OF ENTRIES

Substitution of entries can be made until the entry close date after which time this may be done at the discretion of the Livestock & Entries Department. (This does not apply to the Beef Fatstock section – see specific Reg. 25).

3 CANCELLATION OF ENTRIES

The Society reserves the right to refuse any entry without explanation.

4 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF ENTRIES

The Livestock & Entries Office will acknowledge the receipt of all entries in the form of a ticket letter 7-10 days prior to the Show; this will have a detailed list of entries that you have made, along with all relevant tickets and passes that are required for Show.

5 EXHIBITOR VEHICLE/CARAVANS

All Exhibitor vehicles and caravans must be parked in the specific areas allocated for the purpose. There will be a charge of £20 per caravan or tent without electricity and £40 per caravan with electricity supply.

6 ATTENDANTS ACCOMMODATION

The Sir John Dunnington-Jefferson House offers 10 twin rooms (maximum occupancy of 2 people) and 60 single rooms (to be occupied by one person only) together with washing facilities and toilets in the same building. Rooms are secure, each with basic furniture, bed(s) and a mattress. Exhibitors must provide their own bedding.

Opening times: 2pm Friday 18 October - 6pm Sunday 20 October. There will be a warden on the premises. Exhibitors are NOT allowed to sleep in stalls/pens for safety reasons.

7 DINING FACILITIES

Stock Attendants catering facilities with a bar will be situated between the Halls and will be open from Friday 18 October to Sunday 20 October. Details of times will be confirmed nearer the Show.

8 OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBITS

All stock should be the property of the exhibitor at the closing date for entries.

9 BREAKING THE RULES

Any Exhibitor who contravenes any of the Society's rules or uses unfair means to win a prize will forfeit all prizes and prize money and may be disqualified from attending future shows.

10 DISPUTES

In the event of any dispute the decision of the Show Director or Chief Executive shall be final.

11 EMERGENCY VETERINARY TREATMENT

It is a condition of entry that the Society's Veterinary Surgeons may treat any animal in an emergency whether or not the owner/exhibitor is present. It is the owner's responsibility to ensure that all animals are fit and well when they enter the showground and an animal may be excluded at any time on Veterinary advice.

It is the responsibility of the owner/exhibitor to pay for veterinary treatment at the time of treatment.

12 FITNESS TO TRAVEL/TRANSPORT OF PREGNANT ANIMALS

Animals must be fit for the intended journey before the journey starts and must remain sufficiently fit throughout the journey. This means the animal should be healthy enough to tolerate the entire journey it is about to make (including loading, unloading and any journey breaks) with no or very little adverse effect on it and the journey should not cause the animal any suffering or injury. The means of transport must be designed, constructed, maintained and operated so as to avoid injury and suffering and ensure the safety of the animals. A journey includes the period from the loading of the first animal to the unloading of the last animal. Any animal entered in the Show that is not fit to travel should be left at the holding premises.

The transport of pregnant animals for whom 90% or more of the expected gestation period has already passed, or who have given birth in the previous week is prohibited. Any animal entered to which these criteria apply should not be brought to the Show under any circumstances.

[Council Regulation (EC) 1/2005, implemented by The Welfare of Animals (Transport) (England) Order 2006]

13 PRIZE MONEY VOUCHER SCHEME

The vouchers will be handed to you by the steward. Please go to Hall One Reception desk to cash these in before 5pm on Sunday 20 October.

Vouchers will NOT be redeemed after the Show.

14 DISPLAY OF EXHIBITS

No exhibit may be covered during the show opening hours. Only prize cards and rosettes won at Countryside Live in the current year may be displayed and are displayed at the owner's risk.

15 JUDGING IN THE RINGS

Every animal parading in the ring for competition must remain in its class until the final awards of the judges have been made or consent to leave has been sought from the judges and stewards. All exhibitors in a class are under the control of the judge until such time as they leave the ring upon completion of the class.

16 CHAMPIONSHIPS

First prize winners must where eligible compete for the Championship prizes. Second prize winners must be ready to compete if required.

17 PROTESTS

Any exhibitor wishing to make a protest or objection must do so in writing to the Chief Executive of the Yorkshire Agricultural Society before 6pm on the day judging takes place. If the protest relates to false entry or description, it will be accepted if made within seven days after the close of show. All protests must state the specific grounds and the sum of £40 must be deposited with the Chief Executive at the time.

All protests will be considered by a Committee, normally chaired by the Show Director. The decision of the Committee will be final. If the protest is determined against the objector their deposit will be forfeited unless in the opinion of the Committee there existed good and reasonable grounds for the protest, when the deposit may be returned.

If the protest is determined against the objector they may also be liable to the Organisers for the amount of costs and expenses incurred, unless in the opinion of the Committee there existed good and reasonable ground for protest.

18 PASSES

Exhibitors will be issued with exhibitor pass/es. All passes for all exhibitors are issued at the discretion of the Organiser. A maximum of 4 passes will be issued to any one exhibitor in all sections.

19 DOGS

Dogs are not allowed in the showground during the show with the exception of assistance dogs.

20 CRUELTY TO ANIMALS

Any person causing suffering or any form of cruelty to animals will incur a lifetime ban on returning to the Show. This applies to any owner, rider, exhibitor, handler, or member of the public, who causes any animal unnecessary suffering or duress, day or night, anywhere on the showground or the vehicle parks. Should any person/s be considered to be breaking this rule, the appropriate YAS Officials will be informed and immediate action will be taken.

21 HEALTH & SAFETY

All staff, contractors, exhibitors and visitors must comply with the Health & Safety Policy for Countryside Live 2019 and the legal requirements placed on them.

It is the responsibility of all exhibitors to familiarise themselves with the Health and Safety Policy for the Show and to comply with any requirements placed on them whilst competing at the Show.

Livestock must be under the control of a competent handler at all times and they must use approved restraints which are safe and fit for purpose. Movements on the Showground include areas used by the public and from the cattle lines into the judging rings and handlers must ensure adequate safeguards are in place to prevent an animal from escaping.

All Handlers in the Beef Fatstock and the Pedigree Calf classes must be 14 years of age or over.

Livestock exhibitors will indemnify the Yorkshire Agricultural Society for any losses suffered as a result of their failure to provide competent handlers in accordance with these regulations and the GYS Health and Safety Policy.

22 DISCLAIMER

The Society and its officers shall not be responsible for any accident, damage or loss however caused that may occur to any exhibitor or his servant or to any animal, article, or property exhibited or brought onto the Showground by him. Each exhibitor shall indemnify the Society from and against all actions, suits, expenses or claims on account of or in respect of any such damage or injury however caused.

23 CANCELLATION OR POSTPONEMENT

The Organisers reserve the right to postpone or cancel the Show or a particular event for safety reasons or any other unforeseen circumstances that may dictate at the time.

24 EXHIBITORS DETAILS

Exhibitors' details may appear in the Show Catalogue. Details of prize winning animals may also be sent to local media outlets. This is a condition of entering the Show.

PUBLICITY AND DATA PROTECTION

The Yorkshire Agricultural Society is committed to protecting your personal data and processing it only in accordance with legal requirements. For more details you should request a copy of our GDPR policy. We process your personal data as it is necessary for the performance of our contract with you to facilitate your competitive entry to the Show. We will not transfer your data outside of the EEA (European Economic Area) and will not share your data with third parties, except for Breed Societies and/or affiliated Societies or related Events, to whom we submit entries and results, to be checked for validity and eligibility based on their legitimate interests. Results will also be circulated with members of the Press and published on our website. We retain your data in accordance with our GDPR policy to simplify future applications.

You have various rights in the data we hold including rectification and objecting to processing.

The YAS may photograph any exhibitor or other person on the Showground and store and use the resulting image (including edited or altered versions) for any of the Society's commercial or non-commercial purposes in all and any media, including, without limitation, use in promotional materials and on the Society's website, or supply to carefully selected third parties for use for their own purposes. 25 SUBSTITUTIONS

Substitutions of Beef Fatstock animals can be made pre-show, as ear numbers are not catalogued. Refunds will only be issued for veterinary reasons.

26 CATTLE PASSPORTS

All cattle must be accompanied to and from the Show with their cattle passport duly completed.

27 STALLING & PENNING

Exhibitors will be allocated one stall/pen for every entry made, except where an entry is in a class only open to animals previously entered. Straw will be provided in each stall/pen prior to arrival. Hay and green fodder is NOT provided. Exhibitors may only bring the number of animals for which stalls have been allocated. One stall will be allocated per beast.

All exhibitors and stockmen are requested to note that mucking out must be completed by 7.30am in order to assist with the disposal of muck etc.

The limit of entries/stalls has been re-introduced as cattle will now be housed in a marquee outside of Hall 2. The Organisers may reduce the number of stalls or pens allocated to each exhibitor, if circumstances dictate.

28 CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

All entries must be made on an official entry form obtained from the Livestock & Entries Department, Yorkshire Agricultural Society, Great Yorkshire Showground, Harrogate, HG2 8NZ, and must be returned with the correct remittance by the stated entry close date.

Exhibitors are requested to examine the schedule carefully as they are responsible for entering the correct details and the correct class(es). Any exhibitor who fails to give information asked for on the entry form may be disqualified.

31 REMOVAL OF BEEF FATSTOCK ANIMALS

Cattle passports will be signed from 4pm onwards on Saturday 19 October.

No Beef Fatstock animal can leave the Showground before 5pm on Saturday 19 October.

32 All other cattle must be halter-led whilst on the showground. Stock attendants are responsible for their own cattle at all times.

33 Cattle will not be allowed to leave their stalls except for washing, judging, clipping or on the orders of a steward or veterinary surgeon. Cattle may only be washed at the cattle washes. Animals may not be washed whilst tethered to the judging ring rails.

34 All exhibitors bringing electrical equipment for use in the marquee must provide a suitable circuit breaker. Electrical equipment must have been PAT tested within 6 months preceding the event.

Exhibitors of bulls must also comply with Guidance Note GS36 issued by the Health and Safety Executive concerning the safe custody and handling of bulls at Agricultural Shows, Markets and similar premises off the farm. All other cattle must be halter-led whilst on the showground. Stock attendants are responsible for their own cattle at all times.

42 Calves will not be allowed to leave their stalls except for washing, judging, clipping or on the orders of a steward or veterinary surgeon. Calves may only be washed at the cattle washes. Animals may not be washed whilst tethered to the judging ring rails.

All sheep must be tagged before entering the Showground. These tags are to be recorded by the Stewards at the time of weighing. The Showground will be open for the reception of sheep from 8am - 4pm on Friday 18 October.

46 WEIGHING OF SHEEP

All sheep must be weighed between 12 noon – 4pm on Friday 18 October. All sheep are to be weighed WITHOUT rugs or blankets of any kind.

47 REMOVAL OF SHEEP

Sheep Movement Licences will be signed from 3pm onwards on Sunday 20 October.

No sheep can leave the Showground until after 4pm on Sunday 20 October.

48 All sheep entered for the Show should have been treated with an approved scab control product carried out to the manufacturer's specification.

49 Short Tail Docking - The Mutilations (Permitted Procedures) (England) Regulations 2007

Exhibitors must comply with the above regulations when showing Sheep at the Show, this includes sheep purchased by an exhibitor to which short tail docking applies. The regulations state it is illegal to: "Cause, or permit to be performed" an operation short-tail docking sheep unless sufficient tail is retained to cover the vulva in the case of a female sheep and the anus in the case of a male sheep. Any short docked sheep brought to show are liable to disqualification.

APHA staff will report and trace incidents on every occasion where short tail-docking of sheep has been seen. A visit to the farm of holding of origin will be undertaken to identify and deal with any problems on the farm. If an owner is found to have short tail-docked their sheep they will be liable to prosecution under the above legislation and any breaches reported to the RPA by APHA Inspectors.

EQUINE SPECIFIC REGULATIONS

50 Stabling & Access Times

There will be a 30 minute change over period on the Saturday evening where we ask that stables are cleaned out after use. (The change- over period will not affect those exhibitors who have booked for the duration of the Show). Stables can be booked for a 24 hour period at a rate of £20 per stable, per night. Stables are available from the following times:

- 6pm Fri 18 - 6pm Sat 19 October
- 6.30pm Sat 19 – 6.30pm Sun 20 October

Please report to the Stable Manager for stable allocation. This office will be manned from:

6pm – 10pm Fri 18 Oct. 7am – 9pm on Sat 19 Oct. 7am – 6pm on Sun 20 Oct.

There will not be overnight provision outside of these times.

Persons using the stabling facilities without booking or permission will be disqualified from competing. Straw: There will be one bale of straw per stable after which we would ask you supply your own bedding as we have limited supplies of straw.

Hay or fodder of any type is NOT available on the showground.

Tack Boxes: These can also be booked for a 24 hour period at a rate of £10 per tack box, per night. Times as stable booking times.

51 Breed Society Regulations

All persons entering, competing or exhibiting an animal in a class affiliated to a Breed Society shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the relevant Breed Society and be subject to its constitution and rules (including disciplinary procedures).

52 Passes

Passes will be allocated to exhibitors on the basis of **TWO** per entry/horse eg. One horse in one class; 2 passes; One horse in two classes; 4 passes. A maximum of **FOUR** passes will be sent out.

YAS Members will have free admission to the Show on production of their YAS Membership cards.

53 Equine Flu

It is requirement that horses and ponies are vaccinated with a 6 month booster for Equine Flu. Passports should also be brought with you and will be checked on collection of your back numbers.

54 Equine Viral Arteritis

All exhibitors should read, understand and adhere to the common code of practice for Equine Viral Arteritis (EVA) as published by the Horse Racing Levy Board.

55 Judges Interest in Exhibits

Exhibitors are not permitted to enter any animal/s in a class which is to be judged by a person who has or who has had a financial interest in the animals, or which has stood in his/her stable. Stud fees are not considered to be financial gain. The onus of complying with this regulation rests entirely on the exhibitor.

56 Protective Headgear

All riders of horses, donkeys or ponies on the showground or exercise areas are now required to wear head protection (hard hat) that conforms to the following revised standards for head protection for equestrian activities: All PAS 015; VG1; (BS)EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards; Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following current Safety Standards/specifications **MUST** be worn by all Riders between the ages of 15 to 17 inclusive. All PAS 015; VG1; (BS) EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards.

The most recent additions to the list are the addition of SNELL E2016 and EN1384 (2017); the newest version of the EN1384 Standard will begin to appear during 2018 and is also added to the list. Helmets must be worn with the chin straps correctly and securely fastened at all times.

57 Refunds

Entries not forward for any reason other than illness or injury will forfeit all entry fees. Entry fees will only be refunded if a vet's certificate is provided to the Livestock and Entries Office **no later than Friday 25 October 2019**, with the full Exhibitor ticket pack including all badges, passes etc.

58 Responsibilities of Equine Exhibitors with reference to Class Timings

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure they arrive on the showground in sufficient time for the commencement of their classes. Any ring timetables publicised are provisional and may be subject to change. The Society will not accept responsibility for any exhibitor missing their class(es) and under no circumstances will fees be refunded.

59 Dope Tests

The Society forbids the administration of tranquilisers or other substances which affect the behaviour or performance of any animal at Show. The Yorkshire Agricultural Society will uphold the rules of the recognised Breed Society in the respect of the administration of forbidden substances to show exhibits and will permit such societies to carry out any tests or inspections provided for in their rules. In the event of any such test proving positive Societies may be expected to take disciplinary action in accordance with their rules. Any exhibit found or deemed by the appropriate Breed Society to have received a forbidden substance may be required to return all prizes and awards won at this Show.

Yorkshire Agricultural Society are also able to sample horses/ponies, independently from the breed societies and act on any positive results in the way stipulated and with any additional penalties, deemed appropriate by the show organisers.

60 Groom's Dress Code

Exhibitors are asked to ensure that all grooms entering the Judging Rings are neatly dressed, wearing jackets and hats or a headscarf.

61 Leading Animals. No person may lead more than one animal when moving on the showground.

62 Mobile Phones. Using a mobile phone whilst riding or in charge of an animal is strictly prohibited.

63 Number of Entries in Classes

Where large entries are catalogued exhibitors may be asked to give individual shows in pairs and only the first twelve may be asked to strip and run up for the judge.

64 Substitution of Judges

The Society reserves the right to substitute other Judges for those named in the schedule or make additional appointments. Where time permits exhibitors will be informed of any changes.

65 Stable Manager's Office is situated at the side of the Main Collecting Ring near to the Stables.

66 Age Classification. The age of the horse/pony must be stated on the entry form in years. Failure to state the age of your animal as requested on the entry form may result in the entry being returned.

67 Marking Sheets will be used by the judges in the Ridden M&M classes; these will be on the CSL website following the event.

68 Equine Welfare is of paramount importance and all riders should be of an appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony being ridden (anywhere on the showground, exercise areas or vehicle parks, day or night). The Society reserves the right to take further action (See Disqualifications, Sanctions and Exclusion Orders) against any competitor or exhibitor whose animal is being ridden (anywhere on the showground, exercise areas or vehicle parks, day or night) by **anyone** whose size or weight compromises the welfare of the horse/pony being ridden; this would be based on the recommendations of the on-site veterinary team, who will use the 20% ratio as a guideline (this means the combined weight of rider plus their saddle should be less than 20% of their animal's weight).

This would be based on a relatively fit animal as an overweight animal is also a welfare concern.

69 Indemnity. By completing the entry form you are conforming to the following: You are stating that you understand, confirm and agree to the following statement "To the best of my knowledge and belief, the animal(s) I have entered is/are free from any clinical disease at the time of entry. I further declare that all necessary precautions will be taken to prevent the said animal(s) from being exposed to infectious or contagious diseases from the time of entry to their arrival on the Showground.

Each and all of the particulars given are correct to the best of my knowledge and belief; that these animals are my own property; and that they are duly qualified, according to the Society's regulations and conditions, to compete for the prize or prizes for which they are entered.

To conform, as an exhibitor, to all the Regulations, Conditions and Orders the Yorkshire Agricultural Society; to hold the Society blameless in the event of any illness, loss or damage occurring to, or through, any animal I may enter or exhibit at the Show, or of mis-delivery of the same: and to indemnify the Society against any legal proceeding arising from any such illness, loss, damage or mis-delivery.

FOR YOUR SAFETY

The safety of the public, guests and exhibitors at the Show is of paramount importance to us. We have taken all reasonable steps to ensure that the known risks are adequately controlled making the Showground safe for all visitors and exhibitors.

Evacuation & Safety Announcements

In the unlikely event of an evacuation of the Showground please follow any instructions given to you by Stewards, Officials or Police Officers or over one of the public address systems. You will be directed to vacate the Showground by the nearest exit and to go to the back of the car park opposite the exit to wait for further instructions, unless advised otherwise.

If a full or partial evacuation of the Main Ring or White Rose Ring Grandstands, Exhibition Halls or Fashion Pavilion is required an announcement will be made over the PA system in those areas.

Please listen carefully to any safety announcement which may direct you to a specific area on or around the Showground. Evacuation should be undertaken calmly and quickly taking any personal items with you. Stewards, the Police and Officials will direct and provide you with further information. Further announcements may be made explaining the nature of the incident and any additional action you may be required to take.

You should not attempt to re-enter the Showground or a building until you are advised to do so for safety reasons.

Health & Hygiene

Visiting Countryside Live is an enjoyable and educational experience. However, such visits can never be free from all risks. Farm animals naturally carry a range of microorganisms, some of which may be harmful to people even when the animals appear clean and healthy.

Microorganisms such as E. coli O157 and Cryptosporidium are a particular health risk, especially for young children, expectant mothers and the elderly.

Touching animals, consuming contaminated food or drink and contact with dirty surfaces may lead to infection if the microorganism is accidentally passed to the stomach?

Washing hands thoroughly with soap and water immediately after contact with animals will reduce the risk of infection. Hand gels or wipes are not a substitute for washing hands with running water.

There are a number of permanent toilet blocks with washing facilities on the Showground and their locations are clearly indicated on the Showground map
